Vukmir Eyeing "True" Scope of Practice Reform

Senate Committee on Health and Human Services Chair Leah Vukmir, R-Brookfield, and her staff are working on "true" scope of practice reform, the lawmaker said last week.

"Too often, decisions about licensure and certification for various professions fall into the purview of decision-making of legislators who don't know everything or a lot about healthcare," Vukmir told members of the Waukesha County Medical Society at a town hall in Delafield last week.

While some lawmakers have background in healthcare training and will push back against bills that they feel go too far, Vukmir noted that proposals pushed by lobbyists can often get into law.

"There are many situations like that, not based on what's in the best interest of patients but who has the loudest voice in the Capitol," she said. "And I don't think that's right."

Vukmir's looking at legislation she said will bring together professionals who work in various healthcare fields and decide on the best direction for their practice.
